Hazard	People at risk	Control measures	Review
Normal hazards associated with climbing (i.e., falls from height, impact with something solid)	All involved in the session	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Sessions to be run using techniques laid out in the procedure notes. All staff must have passed the in-house training and assessment. Personal protective equipment must be used at all times. 	
Risk of crates falling and or finger entrapment.	Crate stacker	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Participants warned of danger during briefing. Participants to be provided with helmets and checked for proper fitting by instructor. Message to be reinforced when necessary. When pushing the crate stack over, you must push away from belayers and step back. If a crate stacker is to be used climbers must not step up onto the next crate until the stacker has stepped back out of the way. 	
Weather: sessions may become dangerous due to adverse weather conditions	All involved	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Sessions may have to be cancelled during periods of heavy rain and storms. Slippery wet ropes should be replaced with dry ropes from the store after rain has stopped. 	
Unauthorised climbing	Intruders	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Crate climb rigging to be dismantled when not in use or tied out of reach if being handed over. 	
Hazards arising from the actions of group members i.e., Overcrowding Disorderly behaviour.	All involved	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> The maximum ratio will be 1:6. Group leader must be present during sessions. If group member's behaviour becomes dangerous the activity must be ended. 	
Hazards arising from the actions of inexperienced leaders	Climber	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Activity to be taken over by trained staff or ended and leader to undergo additional training. The relevant paperwork must be shown to the activity supervisor prior to session commencing, copies of which must be held by county. 	
Equipment failure	Participants	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> All equipment to be inspected and logged in accordance with the inspection and replacement policy. Dedicated Volunteer to frequently monitor defect log and effect repair or replacement.
